Key Elements

- Voluntary
- Granted by non-governmental organizations
- Reflect established standards defined by subject matter experts
- Credentials require establishing necessary qualifications and adhering to conduct codes



Key Benefits

- Promotes competition and informed choice
- Enables the public to distinguish between qualified and unqualified professionals
- Prospective professionals can identify necessary skills and demonstrate mastery

Certifications and Licensure Promote Opportunity


 According to a 2017 Working Paper from the Human Capital and Economic Opportunity Global Working Group of the *University of Chicago*, both certification and occupational licensure reduce the racial wage gap among men by 43% and the gender wage gap between women and white men by 36%-40%.



State Legislative and Regulatory Monitoring

In the 2021-2022 fiscal year, the PCC analyzed and tracked more than **120 bills** introduced in **38 states**.

- States that introduced bills monitored by the PCC.
- States with no bills monitored by the PCC in the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

Summary: Provides grants to certification programs and training programs to fund Career Rebuilding scholarships for displaced workers, returning military, and military spouses. Establishes federal database of qualified programs.
